From the Heart of the World ; The Elder Brothers’ Warning— 2007. The Kogi Tribe live in a very remote part of Colombia, with little contact with the outside world. They are able to perceive the great devastation we, the “younger brothers,” are doing to the world. A powerful and timeless message.

The Man Who Planted Trees – 2004 – An inspiring story of how one person can make an extraordinary difference.

Arise – 2012 -<https://arisethemovie.com> – Truly inspiring stories of amazing women doing a variety of activities that heal and protect our planet.

Love Thy Nature – 2014. <https://lovethynature.com>. One of the few films that combines spirituality with the importance of the natural world for our well being.

Racing Extinction – 2015. <http://racingextinction.com> Brings a voice to the thousands of species teetering on the brink of survival., especially due to wildlife trafficking.

The Last Pig – 2020. www.TheLastPig.com. Argo Films. This film follows the process of a pig farmer who can no longer raise pigs for meat as he transforms his life into becoming a vegetable farmer.

Living the Change – Inspiring Stories for a Sustainable Future – 2019 - documentary that explores solutions to the global crises we face today –inspiring stories of people pioneering change in order to live in a sustainable and regenerative way.

David Attenborough: Life on Our Planet. 2020. The film provides a snapshot of global nature loss over his lifetime. Extraordinary photography. Attenborough has produced many films about our planet that remind us of the extraordinary beauty and creativity of this world. Many are available through BBC and free to screen. Some that we have used are **Planet Earth** (2017), **Seven Worlds, One Planet** (2020), and **Blue Planet II** (2018).

Jane Goodall- The Hope - 2020 – National Geographic- This documentary about Jane Goodall shows her fierce commitment to protecting the life on this planet she cares so much about, and finding hope amidst the massive destruction she sees all around the globe.

A Fierce Green Fire; the Battle for a Living Planet. 2012 Bullfrog Films. Spans 50 years of environmental activism, from conservation to climate change, up to the time the film was made.

A Plastic Ocean – 2016 – The plastic pollution in the ocean has become horrifically worse since this film was made. At a showing, current information could be added.

Buy Now! The Shopping Conspiracy – 2024 – Dramatically shows the impact that excess shopping has on the world.

Eating for Tomorrow – 2024. Highlights the devastating environmental impact of current global food systems. Narrated by Kate Winslet. (This is a special edition of “Eating Our Way to Extinction, 2021.)

Ecosophia – Bullfrog Films , 2024.- <https://bullfrogfilms.com> – One of the best films. “Ecosophia” means earth wisdom. This film combines spirituality, science, the economy, psychology, growth, and climate change, showing that what we need going forward is a spiritual revolution.
